## Join Music Guild!

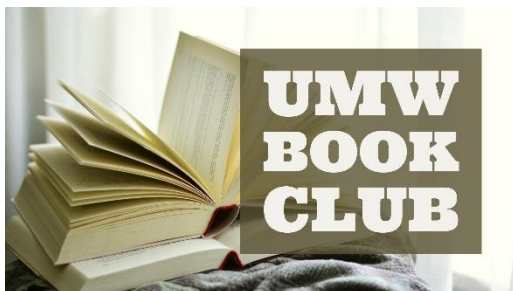
Today, 1:00 pm

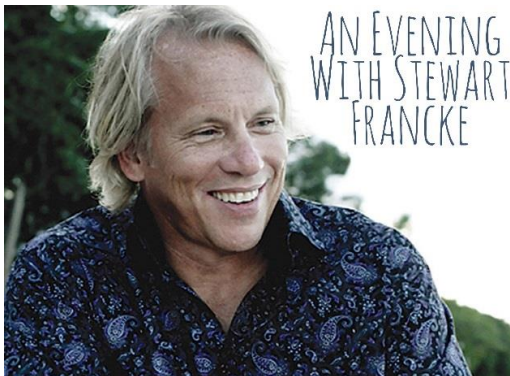

**Friday, January 26, 7:00 pm, Landmark Community Church**



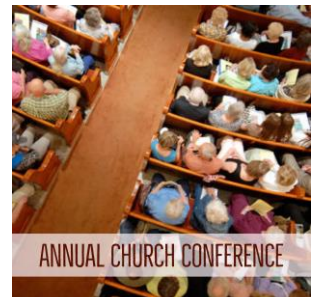
