Get Yourself Connected

At Royal Oak First we strive to make "Christ's Love Real." We want our faith to be more than just an idea or a set of beliefs - we want our faith to impact our lives and the lives of those around us in real, tangible ways.

One of the ways our faith becomes real is when we have formed meaningful friendships with each other. Friendship is one of the most precious gifts. Friends can make the good times even better and the hard times more bearable. We want to make sure that, here at Royal Oak First, there are lots of opportunities to meet, get to know, and become friends with each other. When we begin the program year in September, we hope each of you finds a place to connect and form friendships. These are some of the ongoing groups that will be starting up again this fall:

Pastor's Tuesday Morning Book Group: Every Tuesday morning Pastor Jeff gathers with a group of people to discuss and share insights into some of the most interesting books in Christian thought, practice and theology.

Berean Sunday Morning Bible Study: This group takes its name from the Book of Acts Chapter 17 verse 1, where Paul and Silas preached at Berea and the inhabitants "... received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so" and many of them believed. This class meets at 9:30 am on Sunday mornings and has been a long time favorite of members.

United Methodist Women's Book Group: This group meets on the third Wednesday of each month at 10:00 am to discuss a popular book.

Knowledge Circle: This is our United Methodist Women's circle. These women meet monthly for prayer, learning, mission, and support.

Shawl Ministry: This group meets on the second and fourth Thursdays of each month at 1:00 pm. They create blankets, prayer shawls, mats for the homeless, crosses, and many other items to support the ministries of our church. This group is a lot of fun and a great place for friendship and conversation.

ROMEOs: This stands for Retired Old Men Eating Out. This group of men meets every Wednesday at the Avenue Restaurant on Woodward at 11:30 am. It is a great group for friendship and fellowship. All are welcome.

Women's Bible Study and Book Group: Pastor Myra leads this evening group for women of all ages. It is a great group of women who love, support, and pray for and with each other.


In addition, this Fall, we will be starting up the following new groups for you to make a connection to and with: **Friday Night Supper Club:** Starting in September, we will be offering a monthly Friday night potluck and program. This will be open to all people and will hopefully create an intergenerational experience for our members. These nights will be fun and give us more opportunities to connect socially with each other.

Moms' Group: Bridget Nelson will be starting a mom's fellowship group this Fall. This group will provide a space for the moms of our congregation to read, pray, support each other, and just plain have fun together.

SPRING TREK 2018

Royal Oak First United Medthodist is pleased to announce that Spring Trek 2018 will take place April 2 - 7, 2018. Six days of Christian fellowship with some serious hiking mixed in and more rock climbing and rappelling than ever before for those who enjoy a bit of an adrenalin rush with their fun.

Our destination is Fall Creek Falls State Park near Spencer, Tennessee. At an altitude of 1700 feet, compared to Spring Trek 2016 where we camped at an altitude of 5000 feet, this area should be a bit more comfortable sleeping at night.

The park is spread across the western top of the rugged Cumberland Plateau. We will have access to 34 miles of trails within the park boundaries and will be situated within a 45 minute drive of the southwest terminus of the historic Cumberland Trail.

This park (with bathhouses) is open all year. There are fire-rings, picnic tables, and electricity at each campsite (we also expect to have water at each campsite). This time the living will be easy.

The cost for those using tents is expected to be \$80 to \$100, excluding the cost of any extra activities we might choose to sample (such as a serious Zip-line on the park premises).

Last spring we attempted to complete an overnight backpack hike but a forecast of intense cold during the nights foiled our fun. This time the temperature will not prevent completion of this goal. It will happen and our hope is to have it occur on the rugged Cumberland Trail in a remote area of the Justin P. Wilson Cumberland Trail State Park. The descent to the Cumberland Trail for this hike is 200 feet of elevation in a horizontal distance of 60 yards. This particular trail is not for the faint of heart (or those who have not trained for it) and will be an option for those willing to give it a try.

So start thinking about this excellent opportunity to get out-of-doors next spring and see some beautiful scenery and enjoy some high adventure as well. Set aside eight dollars a week starting now and you will have ready cash next spring to participate in this exciting trip. More information will appear in the fall. General Meeting will begin at 1:00 pm.




