It's been an amazing and intense year of change here at Royal Oak First, and Sanctus, our adult choir, is no exception. Just ten months ago, Sanctus began working with a new director, and at the start of the new year welcomed our wonderful new accompanist, the church organist, Debi Szeliga. Side-by-side, we performed our first Feast of Carols concert together, our first Christmas Eve, our first Easter, and our first large work, John Rutter's Requiem. We peaked at 46 singers during that series, and have welcomed 11 new long-term members.

Sanctus is led by a council, and with them I am excited to announce our 2017-2018

Season. We'll be performing not one short-term session, but four, open to anyone willing to commit for eight weeks of Thursdays and Sundays. At the end of each, we'll be performing a large concert and we'll be reaching out into the community to make music for folks who don't normally get that experience. These pieces include Antonio Vivaldi's Gloria, Dan Forrest's Requiem for the Living, and an opera for all ages, Benjamin Britten's Noah's Flood. As fall kickoff draws near, we'll be revealing more about these major works you can be part of this season.

Maybe you've never sung in a choir before, or maybe it's just been a while. If you're feeling hesitant about jumping into singing, you're invited to Music

101, an evening of fun and learning. We'll develop the basic tools for singing or ringing in an ensemble this year. Join us, Thursday evening, August 24, from 7-9pm, and walk out with new confidence.

Things are looking up for George since he began volunteering. He wants to get off the streets in the worst way and hopes to be in an apartment soon and have transportation. Possessed of a strong work ethic, George was a journeyman carpenter before a serious work accident and his struggle with alcoholism sidelined him. He noted that he was the only black journeyman carpenter who worked on the construction of the Palace of Auburn Hills.

He will be quick to tell you that Royal Oak First has helped him turn his life around. As he said, he is "around wholesome people" here, and he "feels the energy in the church." His faith in Jesus Christ is strong, and he identifies with the carpenter from Nazareth.

George is grateful to Bob and Michelle Prud'homme and Pastor Jeff for their support and encouragement as he works to put his life back together.

Well-spoken and perceptive, George is so happy he found our church where, he says, lunches are served five days a week and God is visible.

Pray for George and all our guests as they make their way down a long and winding road. It is good to know that our efforts are greatly appreciated by George and so many of our lunch guests.

The next time you are in the church during the week, make a point of finding George to say hello.




