### Lithuania Rebirth

In September, Sam Garrett, Charlene Kondrat, Robin Richardson, and Laurie O'Donnell traveled to



Lithuania to attend a conference regarding the future of Methodism in Lithuania. As many of you know, we have been a long standing supporter of the church in Eiguliai. Members of our congregation raised funds to help them build a church building of their own. Unfortunately, the Eiguliai church no longer exists, but there is a new and exciting opportunity for us to be in partnership with the Eastern Circuit of Methodist Churches there.

We were especially impressed by the perseverance of the people. Despite years of oppression, they are still eager and determined to share their faith outside the church walls with the people in the community.

For the first time the District Superintendent will be a Lithuanian! Remigijus Matulaitis is filled with passion about the future there. He is currently the pastor of the Kaunas church and will continue with that role when he becomes Superintendent in January. He expressed that they want to be in partnership WITH us.

The Eastern Circuit, which is comprised of four churches pastored by one minister, Andrus Kask, and his wife Jelena, is in the most need of a supporting partnership. The church where we worshiped was a room in an office building. It served as the Sanctuary, welcome center, office, fellowship hall, and Sunday school all in one. The pastor travels to a different church each week to have services, the farthest being 250K away.

They are interested in launching new programs for the youth and for the elderly. Many of the youth are from single parent families and there is a great need for after school activities. They are especially interested in starting a music program for the kids. Many of the elderly have no family left there, as their children have moved elsewhere to find employment. Andrus and Jelena would like to develop a visitation program to make hospital visits and check in on the homebound.

One of our ideas is that we develop a Skype Bible Study for the youth in both countries and have the youth become "Facebook buddies" so that they can interact. We've also discussed having a Choir Tour every four years so that the each of our youth would have the opportunity to travel to Lithuania once during their high school years at ROFUM.

There are so many ways that we are able to serve there and we are excited to be in partnership with them. Just as we are experiencing an explosion of new vitality in our own church, they are hoping for the same! Now is the right time!

We are bringing back "<u>Noisy Bucket</u>" Sunday this month. On the 4th Sunday of each month, please bring your spare change (we'll take paper money too!), to fill the buckets. Everything we collect will go directly to the Eastern Circuit churches.
