

Royal Oak Holiday Magic Marketplace and Holiday Spectacular Thursday, November 30, through Sunday, December 3





Petition Drive for Paid Sick Leave in Michigan

Right now in Michigan, more than 200 thousand workers don't have access to a single paid sick day. This proposal would ensure that no one has to choose between taking care of themselves or a loved one and risk getting laid off or missing a bill payment. It benefits everyone if sick people are able to stay home when they are sick. The Time to Care Coalition is proposing a ballot



measure that gives everyone the opportunity to earn paid sick time. The proposal provides that people will earn one hour of sick time for every 30 hours worked. Workers could earn up to nine days of paid sick time, depending on the size of the business.

Signed petitions will be submitted mid-December. The petitions are available for signature in the Fellowship Hall for any interested registered voters. Contact Kim Stroud at 248-376-2153 if you have questions or want to help.

Dear Friends,
