

## **MISSIONS**



Thank you all for making 2017 a blessed year for Missions! Your generosity has helped so many people in our community, country, and world. Throughout the year, we have collected over \$40,000 for our missions. You have made a difference.

<u>As We Gather - Lunch Program</u> \$4,000 of your Missions Donations helped us serve over 10,000 meals to the hungry and provide a monthly clothing closet.

**Redford Brightmoor Initiative** We collected 85 boxes of clothing, underwear, and personal care items; over 90 new coats; 45 pairs of boots; 325 hats; and \$1,000 for the One Stop Christmas Shop and the year-long Free Store.

<u>Methodist Children's Home</u> We held 6 birthday parties for boys living at the Methodist Children's Home. Your contributions provided gifts, paper, bows, cakes, candles, pop, and pizza.

<u>Cass Community Social Services</u> We sent volunteers to Cass to work in the kitchen, help with the Green Industry duties, and work on Tiny homes. The United Methodist Women collected scarves, hats, and over 40 boxes of clothing and new toys. We also sent \$2,000.00 for two new Solar Lights outside their World Service Building.

**NOAH Project** We collected 1,500 pair of socks and 400 pairs of underwear for Sock-It-To-Me September. The Golden Sock Award will stay here for another year! We also sent \$1,000 to help support their lunch program.

<u>Covenant Health Clinic in Royal Oak</u>- We provided gift cards for patient prescriptions along with \$1,000 to help them with their day to day expenses of operating the clinic.

<u>Common Ground Sanctuary in Royal Oak</u> \$500 and a much needed refrigerator was donated along with a basketball hoop from our car club, Refueling Our Faith Using Motors.

**Rippling Hope** Teams went to Detroit to help needy families with home repairs.

<u>South Oakland Shelter</u>: A group from our church cooked and served Easter Dinner for the SOS guests at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Royal Oak.

<u>Liberia:</u> We provided \$3,000 for a new roof for the Royal Oak Cottage at the Children's Village in Liberia.

<u>Pentecost Project</u> With help from the whole congregation, over 3,000 sandwiches were made for 5 of our Mission Partners and our lunch program.

<u>Canned food drive</u> We collected much needed food for St. Paul Lutheran, Redford Brightmoor, Cass, and our own lunch program.

4th of July Cookies 150 dozen cookies were delivered by 45 people to people who had to work on the 4th of July! There were many smiles created by this simple gesture.

Fruit baskets 30 fruit baskets were delivered to our homebound members.

<u>Farmers Market Corn Roast</u> We raised \$600 for Missions selling hot dogs and baked goods.

**Eclipse Party** \$6,000 was raised for Gleaners along with hundreds of bags of groceries to stock their pantries.

<u>Lithuania</u> A team of 4 people traveled to Lithuania for a conference, where we renewed our commitment to the UMC there. Noisy bucket Sunday is back and the money collected will help offset traveling expenses for the pastor of our partner circuit.

<u>Hurricane Relief</u> We collected more than \$12,000 and over 50 boxes of cleaning supplies for UMCOR for hurricane relief. We also collected clothing, blankets, and school supplies for the students of a small town in Florida.

<u>Hands 4 Detroit</u> We took over 30 people (including some of our As We Gather guests) to Mexican Village in Detroit to do fall garden clean up at a park, and to paint a community center.

Keep giving like it matters, because it does!
