

Choir Camp Staff Applications Due Tomorrow!




Crafted and Called Tuesdays during Lent, 7:00 pm Prayer Service at 6:30 pm

ROFUM REBITH UPDATE

As we move closer to a completion date of our building renovation, I wanted to take a few moments to update you on the progress and respond to questions that have been asked.

- Resolution has been reached with the City of Royal Oak and the long-awaited inspections have been done. T.H. Marsh, General Contractor has been approved to move forward on some critical work on the third floor which will allow sub-contractors to complete their work.
- We are at 75% completion of the project. The rough construction is mostly complete, and the craftsmen are now starting the finish work. Fixtures and partitions are being installed in the washrooms, new windows on the north wall are complete, the elevator is in place, floor leveling materials have been scheduled to be poured and the operable wall between the Parlor and the Gathering Space is being prepped for installation.
- The cabinets for the nursery and toddler rooms have been installed as well as the custom wood and glass walls for the Library/Conference room area.
- The beverage counter is starting to come together and new slate in the Narthex has been installed. The original slate will be stripped down to its natural beauty and a new protective finish will blend the old with the new.
- In regard to the lien by T.H. Marsh: By statute, T.H. Marsh would have 90 days after project completion to file a lien. It was aggressive on their part to file this so early and it does make conversations a bit more difficult as we work through the many change orders.
- As change orders are resolved and approved, funds are released to T.H. Marsh and the amount of the lien starts to reduce. There are still significant ongoing issues that are discussed on a weekly basis with some agreements being made so that work can proceed.
- Please be aware that we think we see the light at the end of the tunnel, however, we continue to work diligently with our General Contractor, Architect and legal counsel while maintaining the Church's overall interests.
