




Royal Oak First goes to the Zoo! Wednesday, April 25

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Happy Easter and welcome to Royal Oak First United Methodist Church!

We are glad you are here!

Easter sits at the center of our faith and at the center of our lives. Here at Royal Oak First, Easter is not just a day or a season. For us, Easter is a way of life!

Easter means we try to live as if life is always full of possibilities. It means that love can always surprise us, and new beginnings are simply part of the fabric of life. Because of the everyday truth of Easter, we believe that this world can be transformed. So, if you are newer to Royal Oak First or if today is your first time worshipping with us, just know that this is what we are all about—partnering with God in making Easter real all day, every day.
