#### Sunday, April 29, 11:00 am & 4:00 pm




# Disability Awareness Sunday Sunday, June 10

## LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

The 11:00 service this Sunday will be a milestone moment for 13 of our young people. For the past year, these young people have been meeting, sharing, learning, and praying together and today they will stand before us and we will confirm the faith that was first spoken to them at their baptism.
