
Composers from Bach to Benjamin Britten, John Rutter and local composer Michael Burkhardt, will be featured, along with some of our very own Royal Oak First friends!

Disability Awareness Sunday Sunday, June 10


On Sunday, June 10, adults and children alike, will be able to experience what it feels like to have certain disabilities at our Disability Awareness Fair in Fellowship Hall.




Information Cards

Dear Friends,

I don't know about you, but everything in life just gets easier when the sun is shining. When we look around and see the first flowers of spring, this idea of new life and new beginnings starts to sink in.

Spring is the promise of summer days ahead, and I start to remember the many summer nights spent in the backyard of my Aunt Anna. Gathered in the yard with all of my cousins, we would launch into a massive gave of Freeze Tag. I can still laugh thinking about standing in some corner of the yard, unable to move because I had been tagged and was "frozen." I would stand there immobilized, just waiting for someone to tag me and release the "freeze."
