NOAH Project – offers an array of services for the local homeless community. We hold annual sock drives for them, provide sandwiches and attend annual dinners

Methodist Children's Home Society – responds to the needs of abused and neglected Children. We provide birthday parties for the residents with presents, decorations, food and cake!

Cass Community Social Services – provides emergency, transitional, & permanent housing for homeless men, women, and children. They provide free medical services and offer vocational training. We donate food and clothing for their programs. Our United Methodist Women are very involved with this mission




Disability Awareness Sunday Sunday, June 10, 9:45 am – 1:45 pm


