NOAH Project – offers an array of services for the local homeless community. We hold annual sock drives for them, provide sandwiches and attend annual dinners

Redford-Brightmoor Initiative – provides community assistance. We help with the Free Store, food assistance, and have an annual coat drive.

Methodist Children's Home Society – responds to the needs of abused and neglected Children. We provide birthday parties for the residents with presents, decorations, food and cake!

Common Ground Sanctuary – provides a lifeline for individuals and families in crisis. We've provided hundreds of pillows and blankets for the residents.

Covenant Health Clinic – will be here once a month to work with our As We Gather guests, checking vitals, assisting them in making appointments and helping them through the healthcare maze.

Cass Community Social Services – provides emergency, transitional, & permanent housing for homeless men, women, and children. They provide free medical services and offer vocational training. We donate food and clothing for their programs. Our United Methodist Women are very involved with this mission.

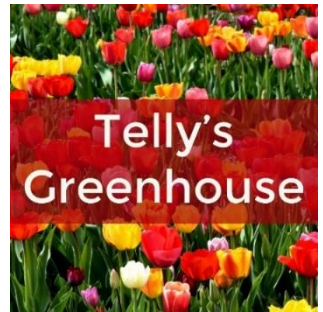
Disability Awareness Sunday
