Tool Time Work Day Saturday, August 4, 8:30 am-3:30 pm



LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

It is Tuesday afternoon and I am writing this from Choir Camp. It has been quite a day—and it's only half done!

Today, over 80 kids gathered together to sing songs of hope and joy. They walked a prayer labyrinth together and held hands reciting the Lord's Prayer. In crafts, they made their own crosses and at meals they took turns serving each other. I watched kids bend down to help tie each other's shoes and comfort each other when they scraped their knees or were missing home. All day, I have seen small acts of kindness and grace—actions that make Christ's love real.

One of the coolest things I get to watch this week is my two boys having the time of their lives. Sure, their parents are present at camp (one of the draw backs of your parents being in ministry,) and they do check in with us a few times during the day, but they don't need us this week. They are being loved and cared for by other adults—adults they may one day be able to ask for help when they are sure their parents would never understand. Andrew Lindblom is quickly become one of the most significant role models in my children's lives. And that's why we have our kids in church—not because we work here, but because we need help raising them to be the kind of men that the world needs. Royal Oak First and Choir Camp are helping us raise good kids!

All week, we have been singing the chorus to "Don't Stop Believing." Today, I can tell you that I believe that:

- Love is real
- Community matters
- Giving is way better than Receiving
- Singing together changes lives
- It truly takes a village to raise a kid
- And, the teachings of Jesus are as relevant and necessary as ever!
