#### **Special Sanctuary Banners**


Mary Nahhat has created two lovely new banners for our Sanctuary for our August Worship Series. As always, she had special inspiration from the Bible.


trim and tile, landscaping cleanup, and more! Sign up at the Missions Table or contact Dave Beatty at tinyhomes@rofum.org for more information.

# LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

This weekend, Pastor Jeff and three other leaders of Royal Oak First are 4,400 miles away, connecting and worshiping with our sisters and brothers in Lithuania. As a congregation, Royal Oak First has been the biggest financial supporter of the United Methodist Church in this Baltic country for decades. We've sent this team to continue rebuilding connections and friendships, working to match our longstanding financial relationship. Keep this team in your prayers as they represent this church, this country, and, most importantly, the love of God in this economically struggling nation.

I had the privilege to spend a week in Lithuania over a decade ago. While we were there, we were received at a beautiful old downtown church. There were roughly a dozen worshipers there, offering us the hospitality of instant coffee and crumbling packaged cookies. Two members, far older than the rest, stood out from the group, a married couple who told us how they were confirmed in the church just before the Russian army took over the building during World War II. They had watched the building go from garrison to armory to library and eventually to disuse during the 50 years of Soviet control. I'll never forget the joy on their faces as they described (through a translator) finally coming back to worship in the space. Hearing their story, our entire perspective on this meager reception changed. The gritty coffee had transformed into the Spirit of hope, and the cookies, in a miracle I can only call communion, had turned us into the body of Christ.

As our family spans the globe this weekend, I hope you'll join me in sharing a meal, telling our stories, and opening your heart to be transformed.
