Church Conference


Sunday, September 30, 1:15 pm

LETTER FROM THE PREACHER

Dear Friends,

It is my honor and privilege to welcome my friend and colleague, Reverend Dr. Christina Wright to our Sunday pulpit this weekend. Reverend Wright is an ordained Deacon in the United Methodist Church and is currently the interim manager and chaplain for the Department of Spiritual Care at the University of Michigan Health System. A native of Marshall, Michigan and a graduate of Northwestern University and Harvard Divinity School, Christina has dedicated her ministry to helping people, institutions and communities organize to experience Christ's mercy and justice.

For most of her adult life, Christina has been working for healing and wholeness within the United Methodist Church. As a self-proclaimed "church nerd," Christina has been attending our denomination's General Conference for



years, where every four years elected delegates from around the world come together to make the important decisions about the life and direction of the church. Christina understands the inner working of the United Methodist Church. She knows our polity, our procedures and has a good sense of the politics facing our church today.

That knowledge and passion is, in part, why we have asked her to bring us the message today, and why we asked her to lead our workshop on The Way Forward this Wednesday at 6:30. The United Methodist Church has come to an important point of decision-making around performing marriages for same-gender-loving couples and ordaining LGBTQ persons as pastors in our churches. In February, a special General Conference will be held in St. Louis where important decisions will made. On Wednesday, Christina will help us better understand the issues, some of the proposed changes, and how those decisions might impact our local ministry. There will be time for discussion and chances to ask questions.

So, we welcome and thank Reverend Wright for being with us this Sunday, and we are grateful for her willingness to share her experience and knowledge with us later this week.
