Volunteer Opportunity at Redford Brightmoor Initiative


Saturday, November 3, 9:00 am - 1:00 pm

Walking on Waves: a Royal Oak First Concert Sunday, November 4, 5:00 pm



LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

In our first year together, I did a lot of listening. I was listening to the ways you described what made this place and the movement here so special. What I heard you say over and over was that you experienced God's love at Royal Oak First.
