

Spring Trek April 1-6, 2019





LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

"I've got that joy, joy, joy, joy... down in my heart! Where? Down in my heart!"

This children's song plays inside my head so often during the holidays. But I have to admit, sometimes the word that echoes through my mind is the "WHERE?" I look at the world around me. I look into my own heart and say "Where?" Where is the Joy?
