All day long, we will tell the story of a young, pregnant Mary and her fiancé Joseph going door-to-door in the little Palestinian village of Bethlehem, looking for a place to give birth to this miracle they are carrying. Will anyone make room for them? Will anyone find a room for God to enter the story?

Making room—it is what Christmas is all about.

Welcome to Royal Oak First's Christmas Eve Celebration—there is room for you here! If this is your first Christmas Eve worshipping with us know that we are glad you are here. Please know there is room here today for you to experience the joy and the wonder of God in our midst.
