We will take a Jeep tour where we will have to wear our winter coats for the peaks. We have a guide who, like our own Jon Cline, will help our kids climb rocks. Whitewater rafting and horseback riding are on the agenda (out of respect for the horse I will not be doing the horseback riding!). One of the best parts of the week is that grandpa is coming along to share in the adventure.
