# CHOIR CAMP

This Sunday, we welcome back 94 of our youngsters from Choir Camp. In addition, we had over 45 adults participating as cabin counselors, class instructors, Olympic trainers, and overall supervisors.

For over 66 years, the Music Guild has been proud to support the Camp and to keep the cost down and affordable for our children. Most people do not know, however, that the cost of the Camp is not part of the operating budget of the Church. Last year, the total cost of Choir Camp was \$38,706.72 with Music Guild underwriting approximately \$20,440 of that amount with individual camper fees making up the difference. This does not include individual scholarships (we leave no church member behind) and, of course, the hundreds of volunteer hours put in by the camp staff and Music Guild members.

The Music Guild relies totally on its fund-raising efforts.
