NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

As we round the corner on August and look back, this has been a summer of disruption and violence. From mass shootings in public places to ugly chants. So let's look at one of the most difficult, most disruptive passages from the ministry of Jesus. In Luke 12:49-56, Jesus says that he did not come to bring peace, but to bring division. Say what??
