

NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

As we round the corner on August and look back, this has been a summer of disruption and violence. From mass shootings in public places to ugly chants. We saw an immigration issue turn into a humanitarian crisis and the tension of division grip this nation. So let's look at one of the most difficult, most disruptive passages from the ministry of Jesus. In Luke 12:49-56, Jesus says that he did not come to bring peace, but to bring division. Say what?? Jesus the Prince of Peace did not come to bring peace; well maybe not the kind of peace the world was expecting.

I have titled the sermon, "I Beg Your Pardon, I Never Promised You A Rose Garden." That's a great tune from the 70s and there's a musical treat in store that you will not want to miss. Jesus never promised us a rose garden; he never said that a life seeking kindness and mercy and justice would be easy. He said it will be difficult and divisive. But he did promise to give us what we need to be the champions of justice on this earth. He promised to stand beside us through every twist and turn of life and he promised to help us find joy amid the chaos.

Let's allow the spirit of the living God to "disrupt" our way of thinking and our lives so that we can be part of the healing and restoration of this country and the world.
