A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

This week I was reading Paul's letter to the Romans. It is a book of dense and deep theology and yet, at the same time, it is a letter of tender and sincere pastoral care. In the opening, Paul wrote these beautiful lines to his friends,

"First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is being reported all over the world."

I could have written those words about you. I am so proud to be a part of the movement here at Royal Oak First.

Your faith inspires me. Your care of each other, for the hungry and for our mission partners is what makes Christ's love real. We received an email from our partners in Lithuania showing us how the money collected through our loose-change offerings is helping to renovate the former communist deportation center into a vibrant church and community center and a note from The African Children's Choir thanking you for the \$4,200 offering you gave to them last week.
