NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

These are unprecedented times as the World Health Organization announced a global pandemic, our local schools closed and our worship at Royal Oak First moved to Online Worship only. Just know that God is with us as we travel these uncharted waters and we will continue to make Christ's love real in new ways. Believe me when we chose the book UnAfraid for our Lenten study, we had no idea what this Lenten season would bring. God does call us to live UnAfraid, to live with courage and hope even in times like these. In the book "UnAfraid", Adam Hamilton reminds us that we must face our fears; we must pull them out into the light and weight them against facts, not emotions. Hamilton gives us an acronym to help do that.

Face your fears with faith
Examine your assumptions in the light of the facts
Attack your anxieties with action
Release you cares to God

This week we are looking all some of the fears swirling around us today. We're looking not only the fear of sickness, but the fear of isolation and the fear alone. The fear of being alone and isolated can lead to felling abandoned and unworthy, and that is the definition of loneliness. In the midst of this God reminds us that we were created in love, created with purpose and valued by God. We'll talk more about that this weekend and we'll look at a story in the Old Testament that will be new to many of you.

It is the story of a woman who was treated unfairly, cast aside and alienated, but she refused to let those around her determine her true value. Her "significance" echoes all through God's story and finds its way into the birth of Jesus.

As James reminded us last weekend: our faith is stronger than our fear. Say that. Know that. Live that. And by the way... God loves you and there is nothing you can do about that.
