Dear Friends,

As I write this, I am watching the snowfall. I call this the annual "daffodils" snow. It seems that every year, just as the spring flowers start to bloom, there is at least one more snow. What I love about those spring flowers is that they are hearty. It is true that some of the blooms will not survive the snow and cold, but the flowers themselves are fine and ready to bloom again. This quarantine feels like the snow that has frozen life, as we have known it. Blooms will be lost, but we are strong and resilient and when this is behind us, we will be ready to bloom again. I am not aware that this has happened in our congregation, but I want you all to be aware so that no one falls victim to this scam.

I know many of you saw Annette Wahl's workshop last Wednesday night called Unafraid: Tough Decisions in this Tough Time. Annette talked about what to expect if you go to the hospital with the virus and what we can do right now to make sure we are prepared. We are so grateful to Annette for
