This week has seen melting heat, violent storms, and beautiful days, and the weather was pretty crazy as well. We know that facing the truth about racism, law enforcement, and injustice in this country will not be simple or easy. God calls us to truth, and only in truth can we move forward as a community and as a nation.

We continue our Joyful Noise series this week. Making our way through the beautiful Psalm 100, we pause at the words, "Serve the Lord with gladness." We have spent the week in Grow groups and devotionals looking at the different ways we are called to serve. Our scripture this week is from the Gospel of John. Jesus tells us to serve by helping those around us who are in need. I can still see so many of you driving by as part of the Pentecost Parade a couple of weeks ago, bringing food and supplies for the Redford
