## NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

This week we are launching a new series: Joyful Noise. That may seem strange against the backdrop of racism and violence we have experienced this past week. In the midst of these struggles, God still calls us to make a joyful noise, but not always in a celebratory way. This week we are looking at that deep-seeded joy that is the God and the good inside each of us and through our "noise" we connect with the God and the good in all those around us. Joyful noise is connectional; it is restorative. I read a quote this week: "The joy of the Lord is found on the road to restoration." That's the kind of joyful noise we will be exploring this week.

I ask you, "Where did you find hope this week?" I found hope in the protestors, the peaceful protestors who took to the streets day after day, despite the violence that erupted around them, despite the unjust arrests, despite the pushing and the shoving. The peaceful protestors showed up day after day, undeterred, and that gave me hope. Racism and the unnecessary use of force in our law enforcement are national issues. Yet there were cities where police

officers and sheriffs and commissioners knelt in the middle of the streets and marched arm in arm with the protestors. That gave me hope. Here at my house, neighbors dropped by all week, just to say "we're glad to be your neighbors," words of encouragement for our biracial household. That gave me hope.
