## NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Happy Fourth of July weekend! In this weekend where we celebrate freedom, it is odd to see how so much of our freedom has been curtailed by a virus. This will not be a weekend of parades and large gatherings; we must find smaller, safer ways to celebrate what it means to be free. Maybe, just maybe, this is a good time to look at freedom through the lens of Jesus. Jesus will refocus us on a different kind of freedom, a freedom from within, a freedom of the soul. This week we are looking at Matthew 11:28.
