Dear Friends,

I am writing this letter on Tuesday morning. I voted absentee weeks ago, and like you, right now I have no idea what will be the results of this day. I am choosing to stay away from the news. I said my prayers this morning, like I try to do every morning. I am having lunch with a friend and then I'll take my boy's shopping for their mother's birthday, which is Monday. Then I'll tune in around 10:00 pm tonight to watch the results and I promised myself I would go to bed by midnight no matter if we know anything or not.

The truth is I have had this Sunday marked my calendar for months. The Sunday after the election. I have pondered and I have prayed about what to say and how to say it. I have asked the Holy Spirit for both wisdom and discernment for the right words to a congregation of people whom I love and who love each other. From years past I already know that for some of you I won't say enough about the results of the election and for others of you I will say too much. So I have simply set down worrying about trying to please everyone and I have waited for a word.

Knowing me like you do, you know that God has placed a deep concern within me for Christian unity. This unity is deeper than just getting along and just being nice. It is a unity that allows each of us to hold, share and live our deepest convictions and passions while still finding room to worship, serve and care for those whose convictions and passion differ from our own. It is a unity that transcends uniformity and frankly is just hard to put into words. You have to see it to believe it!

And it is why when I envisioned this Sunday after the election; I had always envisioned us coming to the Communion Table because frankly it is the only place where this unity has ever really made sense to me. Something happens when the body of Christ is broken and the blood of Christ is shed and everyone is invited to share in God's blessing and mercy and forgiveness and grace - something that nudges us into the unity that only Christ offers the world. And that is why I am asking you to show up for online church this Sunday and please, please, please bring your Communion elements with you - bring a piece of bread, a cracker, even a piece of fruit (some of you have asked if you can use doughnuts) and fill a cup with juice or water or even coffee. Whatever you bring just please show up and be present at this "table." It is my prayer that somehow in the midst of this you will realize that you are sitting at the table with your friends - some who will be thrilled by the elections results and others who will be devastated - and because of Christ's presence in ALL of our lives, in that moment, we will be united in something truly bigger than even this important moment in the life of our nation.

Even while we are apart, we need to come together this Sunday; I hope to "see" you at the table.
