# NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

"One of the essential paradoxes of Advent: that while we wait for God, we are with God all along, that while we need to be reassured of God's arrival, or the arrival of our homecoming, we are already at home." ~ Michelle Blake

I have been trying to get "in the mood" for Christmas. Like I said last week, this year is making that harder. If I am honest, I just miss you. Many of you I haven't seen in almost a year. That is a long time to go without seeing people you love and appreciate.

So yes, I miss the music and the fully decorated church. But mostly, I just miss you. You are the ones that have made Christ feel real to me. Your hugs.

Your handshakes. Your smiles. Your voices. Your words of encouragement. I am missing them all right now. I imagine you are missing them too.

That is why I found Michelle Blake's quote so comforting. She nails the paradox of this moment and this season. "While we wait for God, we are with God all along." That is what Advent is all about - waiting for something we already possess. While we wait for God, God waits with us.

So while I cannot wait for us to be together, I have come to realize that we are together while we are apart. I cannot tell you how much strength I get from knowing that you are keeping the faith and holding on to hope along with me. This week the box filled with hats, gloves, and hand warmers for those experiencing homelessness, reminding me that we are still in this together. Also, this week over 400 mailing labels were picked up, ensuring that most everyone from our church gets a Christmas card from someone from their church, reminding me that we are in this together. And through this entire last month, dozens of special year-end gifts have come in, helping us navigate a strange financial year and reminding me that we are in this together. You are still the ones who make Christ love real - even when we are apart, we are still together.

At the close of the service this Sunday, I have asked our friend Erica Plesco to sing a special song. It is the song Home from the musical The Whiz, and while it is not necessarily a Christmas song, it captures for me what it means to be home this season.

> When I think of home I think of a place where there's love overflowing I wish I was home I wish I was back there with the things I been knowing... And I've learned That we must look inside our hearts to find A world full of love Like yours Like mine

All I have to do to find you this Christmas is look into my heart. It is where love resides.

It is always our home.
