Dear Friends,

I have said before and I will say again, "We miss you!"

Going this long without being together has been hard. And while we believe that we are turning a corner (fingers crossed), we still have a ways to go before we will be gathering for worship, fellowship, and service. That is why when it came to our Lenten planning, we went out of our way to create several virtual and in-person, outdoor gatherings so that we can stay connected.

Our first outdoor gathering was Ash Wednesday and it was truly a blessing! I will be honest; I was really second-guessing myself that morning. I was certain only a handful would drive by for ashes and communion. By the time, the day was done nearly 100 of you stopped by to begin your Lenten journey. Seeing and praying with you was a powerful experience for me. And again, it just reminded me how much you are missed and how good it is to be together - even when we are apart.

I say all this because I really want you to come to our next in-person, outdoor gathering. Next Sunday, March 7, at 10:30 am we will have Drive-In Communion. It will be so nice to "be together." On Ash Wednesday, we were reminded that when we create these sacred, outdoor moments it gives hope to our neighborhood and community. So, doing this together in our parking lot reminds our neighbors that God is still at work healing and reconciling the world. Please plan to join us next week.
