Dear Friends,

Over the past few weeks, I have been asking you to be in prayer for our conversations around reopening the church. Today I am glad to report that your prayers have helped guide our COVID-19 Task Force and Compass Team to come to some really exciting recommendations. Beginning Sunday, July 11, we will be opening the church fully for worship, fellowship, and service!

Beginning that Sunday, we will not need to register for worship any longer and we will begin to offer fellowship time following each worship service in the Gathering Place and Parlor. Following the recommendation of state and local officials, we will no longer be requiring masks, asking each person to monitor their own comfort, health, and vaccination status. Please know that if wearing a mask makes you feel most comfortable,

by all means, please wear one. As always, if you are not feeling well or have come into contact with someone who has COVID, we ask that you stay home.

We will be offering Nursery and Summer Sunday School for our children in 5th grade and under. As an extra precaution, we are asking all staff and volunteers working with kids to wear masks throughout the remainder of the summer. I'll be sending a more formal letter to you next week with more details and an invitation to come home on July 11 and beyond, but I wanted to share the good news with you today.

We appreciate your support over the next few weeks as we continue to prepare for a full opening of the church. Please continue to reserve a spot (through July 4) for worship and wear a mask in the building and during worship. And remember that COVID-19 is a moving target, and while we surely hope we are on the other side of this pandemic, we know things could change. If they do, we will once again do what is necessary to promote public health and keep the ministries of the church vital and alive.

What a journey we have been on together! I have said it before but I must continue to say it again - thank you for faithfulness, generosity, forgiveness, and grace. Together we have weathered the storm. We look forward to engaging in full-time ministry together.
