Dear Royal Oak Friends and Family,

I am proud to report that our children and youth were in mission this past week. On Monday, our 3rd through 5th graders met and made 200 sandwiches to support the work of the Noah Project and six fleece blankets to support our neighbors at Common Ground Sanctuary. In addition, we sent 13 middle-schoolers and 11 high-schoolers to Detroit to partner with the Motown Mission. Our young people worked in community gardens and helped elders with yard work, painting, and home repair. Each day they focused on a word of the day and a key scripture to guide their work. They laughed together, prayed together, shared meals together, and most importantly grew in their faith together.

At Royal Oak First our mission is to make Christ's love real. We claim Faith in Action as one of our three core values. For us, our relationship with Christ is about *both* worship *and* service. For us they go hand in hand. In fact, we know you cannot have one without the other. We give thanks for the leadership of our Children, Youth and Families team of Bridget Nelson, Danielle Moody, Christine Ryckman, Ashley Erard, and Jennifer Semivan for consistently inviting our young people to answer the call of Jesus to serve.
