



Children, Youth & Family Programming-Getting Back into the Routine!



While the ever-shifting landscape of the pandemic will probably change the size of our worship gathering and after worship fellowship, Royal Oak First is ready to provide plenty of opportunities for worship, discipleship and service for you and our community.

I am hoping that you either received in the mail or electronically your copy of "The First Word", our new church-wide newsletter (thank you Lee Trumbull). In it you will find the full array of offerings to stay engaged with the life of our faith community. I encourage you to find a place to connect this fall. Come to worship. Take a class. Sign up to serve. Find a way to stay connected. There are lots of great things happening at your church we want you to know about and be connected to.

I want to highlight three all-church events (further details and sign up links available at rofum.org) that are happening that I would encourage you to consider supporting:

 Sock It to Me September: This is our annual fall drive to support both our friends at the Noah Project and our Community Support program. Warm, dry socks go a long way to ensure the health of friends and neighbors experiencing homelessness during the winter months. We have set a goal of collecting 2021 socks (that is 1010 ½ pairs!) and as always, we appreciate your willingness to support this important mission.

- 2. **Men's Breakfast**. On Saturday, September 25th from 9:00-10:30 am, all the men of the congregation are invited to a morning fellowship, devotions and prayer. Come and reconnect with friends and learn about new opportunities for discipleship.
- 3. **Church-Wide Retreat: Rooted in Apprenticeship:** What does it mean to truly apprentice under Jesus' leadership? On Saturday, October 9 from 10:00 am-3:00 pm we will explore the life and teaching of Jesus and look to apply these lessons to our everyday lives. This retreat will be co-led by our Adult Discipleship Coordinator, Joyce Hollingsworth and myself.

It is such a blessing to be a part of the faith community that has been as faithful, generous and resilient as Royal Oak First. I am looking forward to how God will be at work through us in the months to come.
