## LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

I loved Halloween as a kid. I loved dressing up in costumes. This is me in my Chewbacca costume sometime in the late 70's. Halloween is one of those moments where we literally can be anything, or anybody, we want. In fact, just last Sunday, I stood outside our church for the annual Spooktacular as hundreds of costumed children stopped by our church to trick or treat. It was so fun to notice each costume and talk with



each child about who they were pretending to be. Halloween is fun.

The next few weeks we are going to ask ourselves these two questions:

- 1. What happens when we change out of our costume?
- 2. Are we comfortable just being ourselves?

God has created each of us uniquely. There has never been, and there never will be, anybody else like us.

You are the only you there will ever be.

And yet we know that we spend too much of our adult life reliving Halloween, trying to be something, or somebody else. We know this is really hard work, isn't it?

This fall we have been talking about what it means to be rooted in God's truth and in Christ's love. We have spent time talking about an identity rooted in love, forgiveness, belonging and vulnerability. We have explored how we can be rooted in sacred rhythms that will allow this identity to remain intact. As we deepen these roots we will find that our true selves, the unique person God has crafted each of us to become, will begin to emerge and we will feel more comfortable being ourselves. This is the gift of rooted life.
