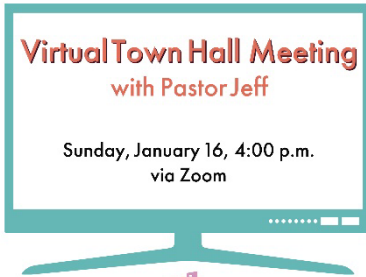

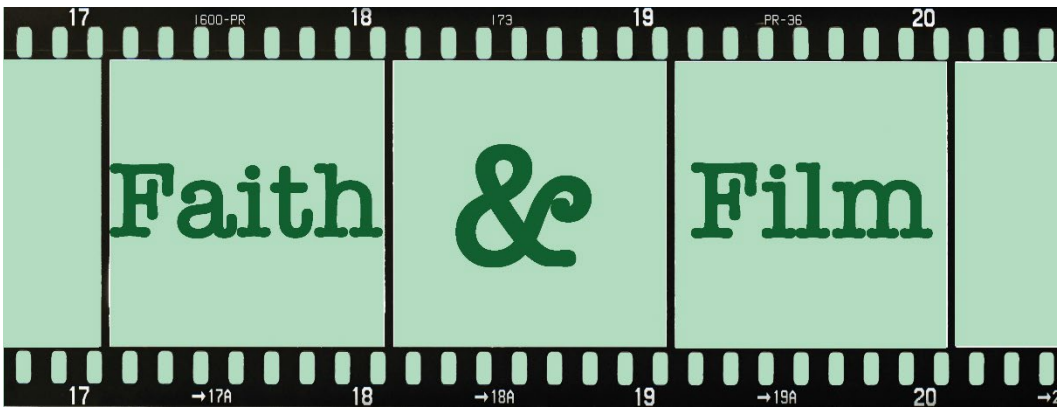

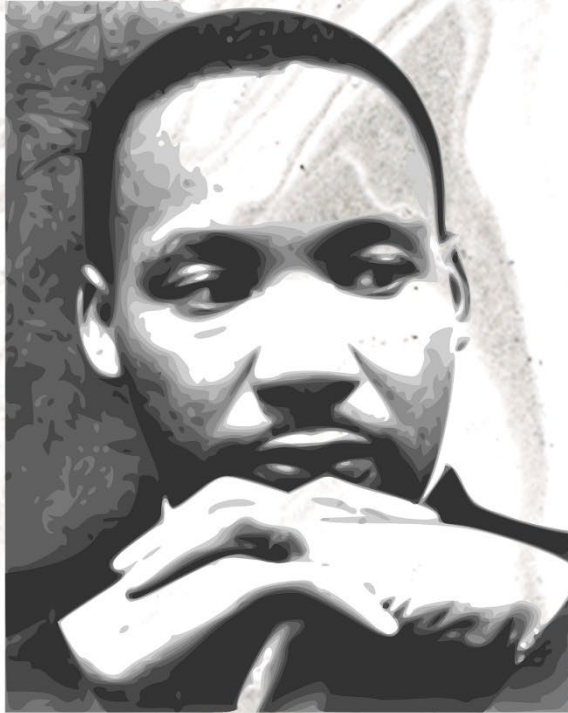
**We will be requiring all attendees to wear a mask while inside the theater.**

# LETTER FROM OUR PREACHER

Sally Field, accepting the Oscar for her work on *Places in the Heart*, said it with such conviction and unbridled joy: “And I can’t deny the fact that you like me. Right now, you like me!” Stuart Smalley said it as a Daily Affirmation™: “I’m good enough, I’m smart enough, and, doggone it, people like me.” I sometimes ask, quizzically: “People like me?”

“Like”, the verb, is one of those words that a good English teacher asks you to avoid in writing. Actually, “good”, the adjective, is also one of those words that a good English teacher asks you to avoid in writing. And we should avoid them. They have little meaning. “How was your day?” “Good.” “Have you met Charisse? I like her.” Hearing those responses, I don’t know anything about your day, or Charisse. We should demand great, exemplary, virtuous teachers of English, and insist that they eradicate “good” and “like” from common usage. Wouldn’t that be nice? “Nice”, now there’s a descriptive word. I hear Charisse is nice.

“Like” can be a preposition as well. People like me. People who are the same. People who share characteristics, values, and virtues. People who share hopes, dreams, and aspirations. We gravitate toward those people because it is with them that we can be our most authentic selves. We don’t have to wear our armor. We can just be. People like me, like people like me.

Now, add “don’t” to those words. People like me don’t. People like me don’t go to college. People like me don’t fall in love. People like me don’t get the promotion. People like me don’t fit in. People like me don’t get divorced, struggle with addiction, or suffer from depression. People like me don’t deserve happiness. People like me don’t have people who like me.

Did you see *West Side Story*? Yeah. I liked it. It was good. See you Sunday.
