
PASTOR CHAT



"BEING MORTAL" BOOK DISCUSSION




VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR PRODUCE COLLECTION

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Greetings Church Family!

First, let me take a moment to thank you all for your gracious support and encouragement to me on this journey to becoming a Licensed Local Pastor. I am so grateful to be able to use this credential right here at Royal Oak First, alongside my partner, Jeff and my friend, Jennifer. We continue to live in the midst of challenging times and yet, the ministries of our church are making a difference and even growing. I am so fortunate to be part of this staff team! Thank you for your support.

This Sunday's message will allow me to share some developments in our congregational care ministries. We have always worked hard to care for all of our people, but this pandemic showed us that we were doing it wrong. I am sure we can all think of a time in our lives when we were trying to do something, but it just wasn't working the way we wanted. Or, we got in over our heads and couldn't even see clearly enough to get ourselves out. Maybe someone came along and told us "You're doing it wrong" or maybe we figured that out ourselves and changed course. I know I have been there!

In our scripture this week, we learn about a time when Moses was finding his way as a leader and got in over his head. It's actually his father-in-law Jethro, who loves him very much, who comes along to let him know he needs to try something different. And what Jethro suggests to Moses not only worked for Moses, but we think it might help us as a congregation to create more connection and better care for our people.

This Sunday, we are commissioning seven of our members into a new and important role as Care Ministry Connectors. This is a first phase of an exciting new model of care. I will fill you in on all the details on Sunday.
