
FISH DINNER CARRY-OUT



DID YOU KNOW that we offer Sunday School on our 2nd floor during both services every Sunday? Children who are 4 years old, and are less than a year away from kindergarten through youth in 8th grade are welcome! Younger children are welcome in our nursery on the first floor, and high school aged youth are encouraged to participate in worship. Children and youth of all ages are welcome in worship if that is what is best for your family.

Children and youth attending Sunday School can be dropped off at the doors of the "Bible Times Square" on the 2nd floor. Parents/guardians can sign their child in and out from this same spot. We use a Rotation Sunday School model, meaning we use one story from the Bible each month, and learn about it four different ways. Our rotations are Science, Art, Drama and Games. We find that our kids learn a story more deeply after experiencing it a variety of ways in our different activities. Our time begins with all ages together in the Bible Times Square where we read the story for the month and sing some songs and watch some videos about the story. Depending on the number of children present and the age range, we are equipped to split into as many as four groups. Age groups participate in a different rotation each week.

During the school year, Sunday School runs for the entirety of the worship service. In the summer, children and youth can sit with their families in worship until the Children's Moment, after which they will be excused to go upstairs.

Our Sunday School program is a critical piece of our Children, Youth and Family program and is coordinated by Christine Ryckman. She organizes the activities and works to ensure there are enough volunteers each week.
