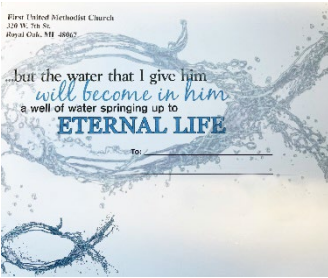

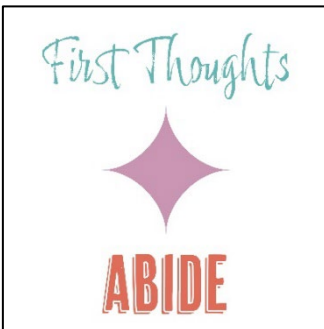
SANDWICH/LUNCH MAKING ASSEMBLY FROM HOME
