FISH DINNER CARRY-OUT HAS BEGUN

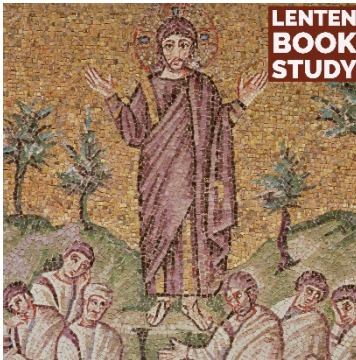
