SUPPORTING UKRAINE THROUGH UMCOR

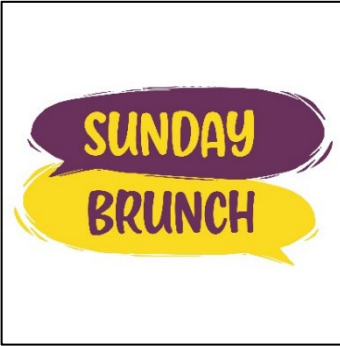

LETTER FROM OUR PREACHER

Dear Friends,

As you know, throughout Lent we are drawing inspiration from the Sermon on the Mount. This week we take a closer look at Jesus cautioning his followers to avoid being judgmental. Those who are judgmental invite judgment upon themselves.

This is an echo of the Golden Rule: Do unto others as you would have done to you. If you don't like being judged, don't judge others.

We also know that people are often held back by their fear of being criticized. Judgmental comments can make you feel overly self-conscious. If a person allows these comments to hold them back, they will avoid taking chances and risks that could propel them into a better future.

In contrast, it can be very empowering to live without the effects of judgmental evaluations. Can you imagine what the world could be like if we all lived without fear of harsh evaluations of everything we do?

If the point of the gospel is that God forgives us and that we should forgive others, then how can we sit in judgment of those around us?

May God grant us a life free of judginess. A chance to dream and try without the shame of failing. No matter how hard the struggle, may we believe friends and family are cheering us on to achieve.
