WE NEED YOUR HELP to reach our Plant Hope Initiative goal of raising \$20,000 for the over five million displaced Ukrainian refugees.


#### We have raised over \$17,000 so far and are so close to our goal!

# LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Our faith while personal is never private.

Our faith cannot be separated from the world around us and it cannot protect us from the toughest issues we face as people and as a community.

In fact, our faith is the vehicle that informs the ways we live and interact with the world and it is our faith that helps us both understand and engage the cultural issues that surround us.

And like every generation, ours is facing complex, tough and often divisive issues. In the last weeks, the cultural conversations around the Supreme Court's 1973 decision, Roe v. Wade and the legality of abortion have taken up center stage. These conversations can be among the most heated and hurtful, so much so that too often I have simply opted to not say anything about them, so as not to risk hurting or offending.

But certainly our faith has something to say about this moment and these issues we are grappling with as a nation, doesn't it?

As United Methodists, we have a unique theological method, a method that helps us discern where God is at in the midst of these conversations and how God may be asking us to respond. This method is different from many other faith traditions and I have found returning to it so helpful when engaging in these complicated cultural moments.

So this Sunday, I will use my sermon time to engage the questions of life and choice that we are facing once again as a people. I won't be telling you what to believe. I simply hope to explore a way that might help each of us clarify what we believe and why we believe it.

Our faith invites us to have these tough conversations.

Please join us online or in person as together we engage this moment as followers of Christ.
