### **PENTECOST SUNDAY - JUNE 5TH**

You are invited to wear RED for Pentecost on June 5. We will be having a special Noisy Bucket that day with all proceeds going to Ukrainian refugees. What is Pentecost? It is the second most important part of the Christian year after Easter. It is commemorated by both the Ascension of Jesus and the Descending of the Holy Spirit. What do the symbols of Pentecost mean?

- Wind: Represents God's first breath of love
- Fire: Represents the Holy Spirit
- Red: The liturgical color of Pentecost
- Water: Represents new life
- Dove: The symbol of peace

Pentecost gives us a chance to ask ourselves, "What are we on fire about?" Here at Royal Oak First, we are on fire about Making Christ's Love Real! Don't forget to wear RED and bring your spare change on June 5!

WE NEED YOUR HELP to reach our Plant Hope Initiative goal of raising \$20,000 for the over five million displaced Ukrainian refugees.


We have raised over \$18,000 so far and are so close to our goal!

# LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

I want to invite you to celebrate two important moments that will happen in worship this weekend. At our 9 a.m. service, we will be commissioning our second team of Care Ministry Connectors. You might recall in January that Pastor Bridget announced our five year effort to ensure that every member and active participant at Royal Oak First is connecting regularly with a caring member of the congregation for prayer and support. So at our 9 a.m. service, Barb Cluff, Paul Kremer, Marian Kremer, Janice Marsh, John Marsh, and Amy Nielander will join Heather and Stephen England, Lynn Huber, Polly Peltier, Kathy Siedler, Nancy Thompson, and Carlene Umstead in providing that kind of connection to over sixty of our church's households. We are thankful for these efforts to really make sure we care for those in our community.

Before closing, I want to say that I am deeply troubled by the shootings across the country this past weekend and especially saddened by the specific targeting of African Americans at the grocery store in Buffalo. As I have stated before, the witness of scripture, and the person of Jesus, make it clear that there is simply no room for racism within our movement on any level. These moments must continue to wake us up and call us to commit to the work of ending bigotry, racism and hatred in all of its forms. We at Royal Oak First are deeply committed to the ministry of reconciliation that our faith demands.

And finally, as COVID cases have increased here in Oakland County, this week, we have had several members of our congregation test positive for the virus including four members of our choir. We know that close proximity and the exhalation of breath particles can increase transmission of this virus, so we will be pausing the Sanctus Choir until the fall. And while the church is not requiring masks to be worn while in the building, we suggest wearing them. Thank you for being safe and being committed to keeping the community safe. Let us be in prayer for the healing of all our members.
