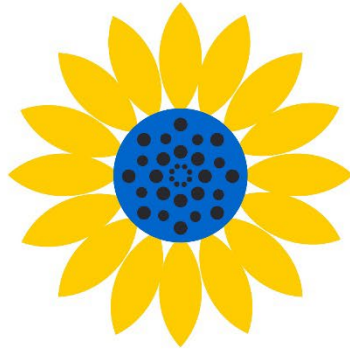

The idea behind our “Person to Person Connecting Ministry” is to **connect the skills, talents, and interests of our members with the needs of others throughout our church and community.**

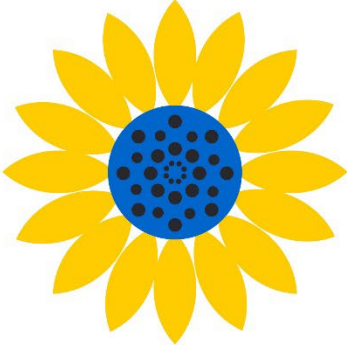

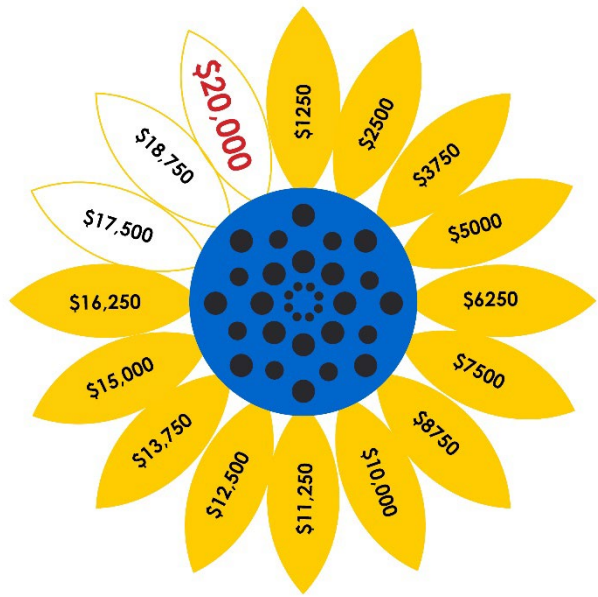
CHOIR CAMP STAFF APPLICATIONS
