LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

In my early twenties, I first met Will and Bill. They were gay men and they were Christian. That was new to me. In fact, prior to meeting them I was taught that being gay and being Christian was not possible. I had been led to believe that they were mutually exclusive.

But experience changes things. Will and Bill were very active in the church Bridget and I began to attend when we moved to Detroit. As I got to know these two men, worship with them, study the scriptures with them, serve alongside them and as a result become friends with them, I realized that they loved God, loved their partners, and had a deep desire to make the world a better place for all people.

I also learned the pain and the exclusion they both had experienced growing up as same gender loving men and how their churches were often the center of that very hurt. They had wrestled long and hard to find their sacred worth after so many years and messages telling them the opposite. It also became clear that finding a welcoming congregation where they could serve as gay men brought healing and transformation to their lives. It was meeting my first two gay Christians (I am sure I had met others, I just wasn't aware) that caused me to ask new questions, read new books, pray in new ways and ultimately be open to a new revelation from God. Over time my theology has evolved from being more exclusive to more inclusive.

I am so thankful that Royal Oak First has been a community that has also been willing to wrestle and evolve into a more inclusive community. Our LGBTQ+ members, their families and allies are active and vital parts of our faith community. Just like meeting Bill and Will all those years ago, our members have shared their faith, stories and life journeys with us and in that sharing has helped us grow in grace and understanding.

It is Pride season. Communities across the country and world will create intentional, public and safe spaces for people across the spectrums of sexual orientation and gender identity to connect, educate, advocate and celebrate. In that spirit, this Sunday, we too, will celebrate Pride.

Our preacher this weekend will be our own Brian Wright. Brian and his husband Mike have been active at Royal Oak First for a long time with Mike now serving as the Director of our Outreach on 7th program. Brian has been in church leadership throughout his life and been a guest preacher for us on many occasions.

Please plan to join us this weekend both in person and online.
