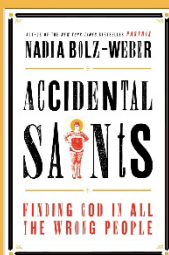

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Greetings Church Family!

I write today from Lake Louise Camp and Retreat Center near Boyne Falls, Michigan. I have been here since Sunday with 17 of our teenagers and some other adults from church. We are doing service projects and enjoying God's creation and learning to be in community with each other.

Closer to home, staff members Christine Ryckman, Jennifer Semivan and Danielle Moody have been working with our Vacation Bible School, and our 3rd - 5th graders on service around metro Detroit. What a week! Children and youth of all ages have been engaged in meaningful time together in our church and in service out in the world. I am so grateful for the staff and volunteers that are making all of this happen at the same time!

These times with our kids are special because we get out of our routines and have more space to focus on our relationship with God and with our friends from church. They can also be challenging because each kid is unique and brings their own joys and struggles with them. Our text for the weekend comes from Romans 9, where Paul writes that we are to hold on to what is good - to be good friends who love deeply. Paul also says not to quit in hard times. We get to practice all these things when we spend days or weeks with our young people. She has helped form young people into singers, musicians, lovers of music and disciples of Christ. We will celebrate Jennifer's time with us later in the summer, and we will miss her on our staff team!
