


CHURCH PICNIC IS AUGUST 10

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

I woke up Thursday morning to a couple of missed calls from Bridget who has been at Choir Camp all week with sixty of our congregation's young people. I knew in my heart that something wasn't right. When we finally connected, I heard a sadness in her voice I rarely hear. They were making the tough decision to close camp two and a half days early. Three of the adult counselors had tested positive for COVID and so in an attempt to contain its spread, they decided it was time to just go home. She told me that the kids were really, really sad. They had waited a long time to return to their place and their people and having it end so suddenly was just hard.

I have been exploring with you the depths of Beatitudes, the nine blessings Jesus shared with his community. Today I hear Jesus' truth, "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." Think about that for a minute. "Blessed are you," Jesus says, "when you have loved something so much that when you lose it - it hurts!" What a blessing Choir Camp has been to the young people of this community. And today in their sadness, they get to comfort each other. This is the way of blessing Jesus points us towards.

So this Sunday we will not be having Choir Camp Sunday. This has always been one of our church's high holy days. Worship will continue in person and online. We are asking all those who were at camp to quarantine at home for the next five days and keep us posted on their health and needs.

The Beatitudes open the door to the way of Jesus - a way that leads to the deepest universal truths of love, justice and peace.

Please be in prayer for all our people. Together we are the love of Christ made real.
