
SUMMER FAMILY SANDWICH MAKING (FROM HOME)

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

It happens here! That has been the little mantra running through my mind all week.

It happens here! What is "it" that happens?

It is Christ's love made real. And where it happens is right here at Royal Oak First.

Christ's love is made real here at Royal Oak First and I get the privilege of seeing it every day.

It might be hard to remember, as COVID has disrupted so many of our patterns for gathering for worship and fellowship, so let me just tell you a few of the ways I have seen Christ's love made real just this past week.

I witnessed Michael Monte, our Outreach on 7th Director, and Karla Goetz, our Missions Coordinator, work together to give a new mother, who was recently without a home, the resources she needed to get set up in a new apartment. From food, to linens, to formula and diapers, they simply made Christ's love real.

I met a young man named David the other night. He rang the bell after hours and I was able to let him in. He was looking for a recovery meeting. It was his first meeting ever. These are a few of the ways Christ's love has been made real in this past week.

It was a good feeling to be reminded that even though we can't all get here, through our prayers and generosity, "it" - Christ's love - is still being made real right here!
