24/6: DISCOVERING THE ANCIENT WISDOM OF SABBATH FOR A MODERN WORLD



LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

I was reading this morning in Paul's letter to the Ephesians. Paul was encouraging the early church to "live lives worthy of their calling in Christ."

What makes us worthy of such calling? Not what we might think.

I would think that Paul would challenge his followers to great acts of faith and charity. Paul would ask them to prove their relationship with Christ by traveling to far off places to share their faith or building bigger ministries to feed and take care of the hungry and homeless.

This is not what Paul points us towards when it comes to living worthy lives. No, Paul says these are the marks of a life that reflects our faith: "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love." ---Ephesians 4:2

Be patient. Bear with one another in love.

Think about that for a minute. Paul only gives this counsel because he knows that sometimes in the Christian community people will drive each other a little crazy. Sometimes we will irritate and frustrate one another. Sometimes we will disappoint and fail one another.

Paul is clear. The Christian life is the human life and therefore we can never be perfect. Therefore the distinguishing mark of our faith is the call "to be patient, bearing with one another in love."

That is just a fancy way to say we need to forgive each other - all the time.

How are you at forgiveness?

Is there anyone who needs your forgiveness?

What about forgiving yourself - how's that going?

This Sunday Erica Plesco, fresh off her honeymoon, will help us think about how forgiveness works in our lives and world. Thanks Erica!
