
CHRISTMAS GREENS SALE IS HERE!

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

God said, "This is the symbol of the covenant that I am drawing up between me and you and every living thing with you, on behalf of every future generation. I have placed my bow in the clouds; it will be the symbol of the covenant between me and the earth.

--Genesis 9:12-13

Dear Friends,

God made us a Rainbow Promise.

In the story of Noah, the rainbow appears on the other side of disaster.

Remember the story - Noah's entire world is falling apart, storms are raging and everything that was familiar is being destroyed. Noah is hunkered down in a life boat, crammed in with the things he hopes will survive this apocalyptic moment. He has no idea how long this will last and if there is even a glimmer of hope to which he can hold on to.

Life has Noah moments. Moments when the whole world is falling down around you, when forces larger than us, forces beyond our control, are tearing down everything that was once familiar.

In the midst of Noah moments, sometimes all you can do is ride out the storm.

We have been living through that season as an entire planet for almost two years now. The COVID-19 global pandemic has rocked our world, flooding us with uncertainty and fear, drowning out so much of what was once familiar.

In midst of these storms, we look for rainbows. We look for signs of hope. We need these signs, no matter how small, to remind us that goodness and mercy are still possibilities.

Look for rainbows. Be the rainbow.

In the earliest days of the pandemic, my little family sought to be the rainbow to our neighborhood. In those earliest days of isolation and confusion, we simply passed out a flyer to our neighbors saying that on Saturday evenings from 7:00-7:20 p.m., we would come out on our porch and we would play dance music. And guess what - dozens of neighbors came out. We did the "YMCA" and the "Chicken Dance". We did the "Macarena". We let Kool & The Gang's "Celebration" ring out through our streets.

We danced. We waved. We laughed. We checked in with each other. We remembered that even in the midst of this storm, we could find joy. And we did this together for the next 10 weeks. These little dance parties became a rainbow in the midst of the storm.

This storm is not over. And the world is still in need of rainbows. So look for rainbows. Be the rainbow.
